

# Holly Jolly Christmas Mercury Slate



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## Supplies:

- **Stamp Sets** – Holly Jolly Christmas (150471)
- **Card Stock** – Smoky Slate (131291); Whisper White (106549); Basic Gray (121689); Shaded Spruce (147006)
- **Stamp Pads** – Smoky Slate (147113)
- **Misc.** – Mercury Glass Designer Acetate (150441); Frosted Frames Dies (150658); Dimensionals (104430); Metallic Pearls (146282); Multipurpose Liquid Glue (110755); Silicone Craft Sheet (127853); Stamping Sponges (141337)

## Measurements:

- Smoky Slate: 8½" x 5½" scored at 4¼" (21cm x 14.8cm scored at 10.5cm)  
4⅛" x 5⅜" (10cm x 14.3cm)
- Basic Gray: 2¾" x 3¾" (7cm x 9.5cm)
- Shaded Spruce: scraps (leaves)
- Whisper White: 2⅜" x 3¾" (6cm x 9.5cm) 4" x 5¼" (9.5cm x 13.8cm)
- Acetate: 4⅛" x 5⅜" (10cm x 14.3cm) 4" x ⅜" (9.5cm x 1cm)

## Instructions:

1. Take the leaves die and die cut it twice with Shaded Spruce cardstock. This will give 4 leaves (2 for the card front, 1 for the inside of the card and 1 for the envelope).
2. Cut one of the sponges into 6 pieces. Put 5 of them aside for other sponging projects.
3. Peel the fine plastic protective layer from the acetate pieces.
4. Squeeze a small amount of Multipurpose Liquid Glue onto the Silicone Craft Sheet.

5. Take the other piece of sponge and dab it into the glue and then dab it all over the back of the large acetate piece. Attach the acetate to the single piece of Smoky Slate cardstock.
6. Adhere the acetate/Smoky Slate to the front of the card base.
7. Attach two of the leaves to the top of the small piece of Whisper White with the sponge and glue. Stamp the sentiment below the leaves with Smoky Slate ink. Adhere the white layer to the Basic Gray layer and add to the card front with Dimensionals.
8. Add some silver metallic pearls around the sentiment.
9. Use the sponge and glue to attach the small piece of acetate to the lower edge of the large piece of white cardstock. Attach one of the die cut leaves in the top right hand corner and then add the white layer to the inside of the card.
10. Attach the final die cut leaf to the lower left hand corner of the envelope.

Note: Keep the piece of sponge used for glue in a zip lock bag and use for future projects. This is a great way to add adhesive to small die cuts without getting adhesive everywhere.
